




COMPLAINT RESOLUTION PROCESS




1. The appropriate authority will receive complaints and applications 2. Address the Brievance and forward the

- The appropriate authority will receive complaints and requests from citizens and corporate (business) entities.
- The competent authority shall make a decision in accordance with the law and submit it to the relevant CRC.
- The "Digital Service Provider" will receive a notification in line with the findings and determination of the relevant authority. Included in the notification will be: 3.1. remove or restriction of content, or. 3.2 Limiting access to the pages and websites.
- If the violation is not corrected within the period specified in the notification, or if it is impossible to contact the online service provider, measures will take to restrict access from Mongolia. /blacklist.mn/
- If the digital service provider eliminates the violations, it may be removed from the "blacklist.mn" list and access can be restored based on the conclusion and decision of the relevant authority.

In the event of the publication of content that violates Mongolian laws, the website that violates the law is blacklisted by decision and conclusion of the authorized body and access to it from the territory of Mongolia is restricted through DNS system registration.







Meta "Government Case Work Channel"

The "Government Case Work Channel" works solely to restrict content from the Facebook platform that violates Facebook's Community Standards and applicable laws of Mongolia.



X "Legal request submission system"

We are working with the "X" platform to take technological measures based on the decisions and conclusions of the authorized bodies in the event that content that violates Mongolian laws is published.



"Youtube trusted partner"

Starting in May 2021, the Telecommunications Regulatory Commission has been working with the YouTube platform to report illegal content through the "trusted partner" mode.



"Internet Watch Foundation" report system

In collaboration with the United Nations Children's Fund, IWF's child sexual abuse images and videos reporting and restriction system was introduced as an add-on to the IWF portal site ekids.mn.




Website service providers

Launched a reporting channel for potential violations of Twitter rules and terms of service in collaboration with X Platform.

- Collaborating with YouTube started in May 2021.
- Utilized the "trusted partner" process to inform and address illegal content on the platform.

- The Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) processed a total of 11/256 applications (2020-2024).







Response to official request - 89%



In the first half of 2025, 9,192 pieces of content were removed from a total of 741 requests. Of the requests, 6,716 (73%) pieces of content were removed.






